Currently, we offer two high school bands, the Concert Band and the Wind Ensemble. Membership in these groups is acquired through audition. Both groups are combined to form the Spartan Marching Band. We also offer jazz and chamber ensemble experiences throughout the year.

Through learning, rehearsing, and performing music, it is our goal that the students of the instrumental music program become:

Creative Problem Solvers who can think critically and can make decisions through artistic modes and in situations where there are no standard answers.

Culturally Aware Citizens who have a sense of history and an appreciation for the fine arts through multicultural experiences.

Collaborative Workers who are self-confident, receptive to others' ideas, and utilize peer input to develop interpersonal relationships within the framework of their setting.

Confident Leaders who can lead by example as well as by providing a wealth of knowledge to their group. Leaders must also be able to motivate and manage others for a common good.



How does band work in my schedule?

As a freshman, all ICHS students take five core classes and one elective. Your band class will be your elective choice and will be for an entire year. Foreign language is considered an elective and may be scheduled in any elective opening. In addition, you should be able to take band for all four years in high school and not miss any college-prep, advanced placement, or other graduation requirements.

Spartan Marching Band

The Spartan Marching Band is an extension of your band class. Both bands are combined to form the marching band. This exciting ensemble provides entertainment at home football games, local parades, festivals, and various community events. The members of the Spartan Marching Band are very dedicated and have lots of fun!

Participating in the Marching Band involves an exciting experience at a week-long summer camp where the students become comfortable with the various aspects of marching band technique as well as learn our half-time show for the upcoming football season. The Marching Band rehearses and performs from August through mid-October.
