NEWS FROM THE DEAN OF STUDENTS

The 2017-2018 school year is off to a successful start! Here are just a few reminders as we begin the new year:

Excused, Approved Absences: The following are legitimate reasons for not being in school: illness, recovery from an accident, required court attendance, family emergencies, and family vacation (prearranged absence). Parents are encouraged to schedule their child's appointments with doctors and dentists during non-school hours. If your child is absent from or will be late for school, please be sure to call the office to excuse him/her before 9:30 a.m.

Tardiness: Each student is expected to be in his/her assigned location throughout the school day. If a student is late in arriving at school, s/he is to report to the school office before proceeding to his/her first assigned location. Students are to be in class and seated when the bell rings. Discipline for tardies will be as follows:

3 tardies - per class, per semester - Warning

4 tardies - per class, per semester - 1 After-School Detention 5 tardies - per class, per semester - 1 After-School Detention

6 tardies - per class, per semester - 2 After-School Detentions

Tardies will reset at the beginning of the 2nd semester, which begins January 29th.

Handbook Reminder - Lockers: Each student is issued a locker, which is the property of Imlay City Schools, for their use during the school year. If a student has difficulty opening a locker, s/he should report the problem to the office. Under no circumstances should lockers be altered in any way (this includes "jamming" lockers to avoid having to use the combination). Fines will be assess for all damages incurred to lockers during the school year.

Students are not to "jam" their lockers. "Jamming" lockers not only can cause damage to the lockers, but also makes the students vulnerable to theft. Weekly checks will be done by building aides to "un-jam" lockers. Those students will receive warnings. Students who continuously "jam" their lockers will receive disciplinary consequences. Please speak to your child about the importance of locking their lockers appropriately.

PARENT TEACHER CONFERENCES

To best accommodate parents for Parent/Teacher conferences this year, teachers will be assigned, by grade level, to specific locations in the building. Teachers will be available on a first come, first served basis so appointments are not necessary.

Conferences will be held on October 23 and 25 from 5:00 p.m.-8:00 p.m. and October 26 from 11:30 a.m.-**2:30 p.m.** Parents can come anytime to speak with teachers between these times.

EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

In an effort to safeguard your child if sent home in the middle of the day due to an emergency, the following procedures will be used:

EMERGENCY INFORMATION - It is essential that you have updated emergency information on file at the middle school. This information will identify at least two (2) "safe places" that you want your child to go to in case of an early school closing. You should not depend upon siblings to be a caretaker for your child (if not in the same school) as only this school may be closed.

NOTIFICATION/PICKUP - You will be notified through Power Messenger, local radio or television stations, if possible. Students will be released to parents or other designees noted in the emergency information.

BUSING - Your child will not be permitted to ride a bus other than one already assigned. If your child normally walks to school, s/he may not ride a school bus. The reasons for this relate to overcrowding, liability factors and increased confusion.

CONFUSION - Though we have experienced school closings in the past and this procedure has worked well, an air of excitement tends to prevail. It is essential that everyone remain calm and collected so the dismissal procedure can work effectively.

We are as concerned as you are about the safety of your child in early dismissal situations. We appreciate your cooperation and assistance in creating the safest possible environment for students upon any early dismissal.

BUS PASSES

Bus passes for students going home with other students will only be issued if the student has a signed note from his/her parent. If students need to get off their bus at a different stop, they will also need to bring a note from their parent. The student must bring either note to the office before lunchtime to be stamped with a bus pass.

Middle School students are not allowed to ride the K-5 bus home after school. Students need to have their transportation figured out before staying after school.

BAND 101

The Imlay City Bands will be offering an opportunity for students to learn a band instrument: Flute, Clarinet, Alto Sax, Trumpet, Trombone, Percussion. (other instruments upon request). You will work with Mr. Pries, as well as many of the Imlay City High School Wind Ensemble musicians. Classes will meet Thursday's from 2:30-3:15 in the Imlay City Middle School Band Room. While we don't do any formal Halloween celebrations, students are allowed to dress up, on October 31st, as long as: costumes follow the school dress code and do not violate the school sexual harassment policy (ex. cross dressing); costumes do not include props that violate the school/state weapons policy; costumes do not cover part or all of students' heads or faces; costumes and makeup are not distracting to the learning environment; and costumes do not cause students to miss class time due to readjusting or fixing parts of the costume. Students violating these rules will have to either go home or change out of their costumes.
